Personal Data Backups

Welcome to March and hoping for a beautiful Spring. This month's topic will focus on personal data back-ups while also highlighting one of the many Artificial Intelligence tools. I will stress the idea of only using A.I. tools for the right reasons and always triple checking the data that is given. With that idea being covered, you can thank Google Gemini for this month's breakdown of personal data backups:

"Using redundancy for personal data backups means storing multiple copies of your important files in different locations. This strategy protects you from data loss due to a single point of failure, such as a hard drive crash, theft, or natural disaster. Essentially, if one copy is lost or damaged, you have others to fall back on. Here's a breakdown of key aspects:

- Why it's important: Redundancy mitigates the risk of losing irreplaceable data like photos, documents, and videos. Single backups are vulnerable.
- •How to implement it: Common methods include:

Store the backups on at least two different media types (e.g., internal hard drive, external hard drive, cloud storage).  - •Security: Ensure your backups are encrypted, especially if stored offsite or in the cloud, to protect your data from unauthorized access.

In summary, redundancy is crucial for robust personal data backup. 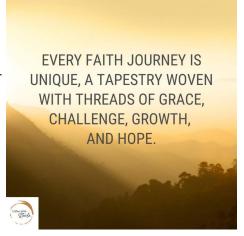

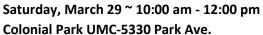
Outreach

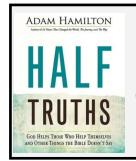
