The Monthly Message

IN ESSENTIALS, UNITY IN NON-ESSENTIALS, LIBERTY IN ALL THINGS, CHARITY

Incorrectly attributed to John Wesley, the above saying still merits appreciation in my opinion. It speaks to the reality that not everything is equally important. Of course, the conflict comes because we often do not agree on what constitutes the "essentials." We are human and rarely is there unanimity on most topics. I can almost guarantee you "water is wet" would have some dissenters. So often we focus on what we think is essential that we forget the third admonition: "In all things, charity."

By now most of you have heard some of the decisions made by the 2020/2024 General Conference. The one that has drawn the most coverage is we removed "the practice of homosexuality is incompatible with Christian teaching" from our Book of Discipline. The result of that is we also removed our bans on same-sex weddings and gay clergy. Obviously, not everyone agrees with these changes. My desire at Bartlett UMC is to be a pastor for all, regardless of your opinion on these issues.

For me these ultimately are "non-essentials." By this I mean it is not essential to our ministry that we host same-sex weddings or be open to a gay pastor. In fact, I believe such actions would be detrimental to the ministry of Bartlett United Methodist Church given my reading of the congregation as a whole. I also believe following such a course would hinder our ability to be the strongest "mission station for Jesus" ten years from now.

The Trustees of Bartlett UMC recommended that our Facilities Usage Policy be amended to include the following. "Same-sex weddings shall not be held on the campus of Bartlett UMC." The Staff-Parish Relations Committee recommended that Bartlett UMC is not open to receiving a gay pastor. Both of these recommendations will be sent to the Church Council for approval.

I realize within our congregation we are not of one opinion on the decisions made by General Conference. Some are happy for family members who feel less ostracized by the UMC. Others are dismayed by what they see as a clear departure from the traditional interpretation of Scripture. The Trustees and SPRC made their recommendations based on what they believe is best for Bartlett UMC. They were not made with malice, but out of genuine concern for how we can best be the Church in our community.

What is MFA?

Multi-factor authentication (MFA) is a feature that is utilized with online accounts or applications to verify a user to an account. Chrome, Outlook, Microsoft Edge, Windows applications, and Apple all use this tool. Users can use apps, texts, an automated phone call, or email to use a randomized number or token to accomplish MFA. Most users will be aware of this in the workplace but I highly recommend all users to utilize this tool for anything that is used online with an account. With summer upon us I'm looking for some help with pressure washing around the church. Need to be 16 years old or older, if interested contact me here at the church 901-386-4563.

We have been in the Sanctuary building going on 22 years and the age is causing the equipment to wear out. We are in the process of replacing one of the compressors in the chiller that cools the Sanctuary. So far this year we have replaced 5 air conditioner units. In the 23 years I have been working at BUMC, I have replaced 34 AC units. The average life span of these AC units is 16 years, so I have tried to replace 5 of the oldest ones every year but that changes when one goes out unexpectedly. We still have some units that are using R-22 refrigerant which is phased out and expensive. Maybe I'll make it another 23 years.
